In this steepy town, the first modern university of Asia was established and Srirampur Mission, ushering in the golden era of Indian printing. The history of this town can be traced back to 1756 when Danish traders got this place from the nawab of The city was renamed Fredericsangar after the Danish king Frederic V. But that name didn't last.
